OUR PHILOSOPHY

Concern for Animals (CFA) promotes the welfare of animals as pets or if abandoned, in public or private homes or facilities. CFA also provides education and information to the public about animal care and proper treatment. CFA supports and promotes the humane treatment of animals, and supports animals that are victims of crime by attending legal hearings and trials. CFA raises and allocates funds for these purposes according to the laws of Washington State and the United States, and is working toward the establishment of an adoption and spay/neuter program and facility.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

It's hard to believe we are now in our 3rd decade of providing much needed service to our 4-legged companions throughout Thurston, Mason and Lewis Counties. Since 1980, we have assisted approximately 50,000 animals with spays/neuters and emergency medical expenses. In addition, we are supporting pet owners with food and supplies they may not otherwise be able to afford due to financial difficulties in these trying times.

Another important aspect of the work of Concern For Animals (CFA) is to find homes for abandoned or homeless pets in the tri-county area. This past year has seen an increase in the number of successful pet adoptions through our affiliations with both PetSmart® and Northwind Pet Care Center. CFA remains dedicated to our no-kill philosophy and to providing the respect and care that all animals deserve.

Our 4TH annual November fundraiser and wine-tasting event was a huge success and continues to grow each year. In 2010, this event brought in almost \$24,000. We had approximately 500 animal-lovers who came and supported us by bidding on over 200 items that had been donated for our cause. The attendees were able to sample the offerings from 7 local wineries, 1 beer brewer, 2 local restaurants and several other vendors who sold various food- or pet-related products.

In addition, on the evening of this event, a dog and her puppies, as well as a tiny kitten, were finally rescued from behind a restaurant in Lacey. They were brought to the event where the kitten was immediately adopted. It was a great way to show the attendees the kind of work Concern for Animals does. "Lacey" and her pups were taken to Northwind Pet Care Center for rehabilitation, and eventually all were adopted by caring homes.

This annual December event encouraged pet-lovers to bring in all manner of pets from avian to reptilian to our furry friends, where photos were taken with Santa at PetSmart® at their Lacey location.

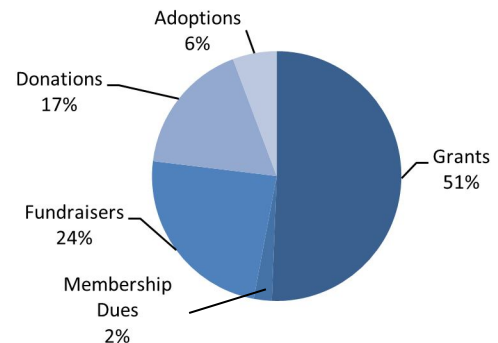
NEW WEBSITE AND FACEBOOK

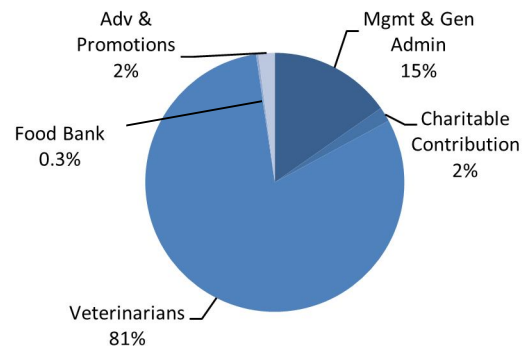
