
Feeding the pets of Western Washington weekly, our team works to make sure families don't have to choose between providing food for themselves or their pets.

One of CFA's most utilized programs is our weekly pet food bank. Every single day, 10-35 local pet owners call to sign up for a pet food bank visit.

Across the four counties we serve, the poverty level averages out to 12.7%. This means that around 67,000+ of our neighbors are struggling to feed not only themselves, but their pets as well. Rain or shine, our team will always work to provide for these pets and their people.




Included in 2024's expenses is a complete software upgrade (custom implementation of a Salesforce system) as well as increased employee costs from addition of a new, part time staff member.

2025 PROJECTED NEEDS

Below are our projected needs for 2025 based on our approved budget and forecasted monthly voucher disbursement. Many of you will receive requests for donations and grant applications during the 2025 calendar year from our team, but if any of our critical, life-saving programs speak to you directly we invite you to contact us about funding them immediately.

CFA EMERGENCY MEDICAL PROGRAM - \$20,000

This program saves animals facing life-threatening situations. This includes animals hit by cars, with broken limbs, suffering poisoning, and generally facing euthanasia if owners cannot pay for treatment.

CFA MEDICAL PROGRAM - \$104,000

This is one of CFA's most used programs and provides veterinary care for animals experiencing non routine medical issues. This includes vomiting, skin issues, abscesses, broken teeth, and any other condition that is not normal for the animal.

CFA SENIOR PET OWNER PROGRAM - \$61,500

Local seniors are in desperate need of this program. Many local seniors that qualify for this program will routinely split their own meals with their pets, forgo purchasing their own needs to save up for veterinary care, and depend on their animal for companionship and a continued, positive quality of life.

CFA SPAY/NEUTER PROGRAM - \$61,500

Spaying or neutering your pet is the first step in making sure they live long, happy, healthy lives. It is also the biggest tool we have to help fight the problem of overpopulation. This program helps pets get these important procedures and lowers the number of unwanted, suffering pets in the community.

CFA RABIES VACCINATION PROGRAM - \$2,000

This program can help qualified pet owners in Thurston, Mason, Lewis, and Grays Harbor County with the cost of state required rabies vaccines. This program covers the entire cost of the rabies vaccination itself. In WA, rabies vaccinations are required by law for cats, dogs, & ferrets (WAC 246-100-197).

CFA PET FOOD BANK - \$12,000

The CFA Pet Food Bank has become a fixture in the community. Every week we supply essentials like food, litter, and grooming supplies, alongside enrichment items like toys and treats, to members of our community struggling to make ends meet. Hundreds of pets depend on this program every month.
